Establishment of the first women's lipid clinic in Iraq

The Iraqi Lipid Clinics Network collaborates with the Authority of Health & Medical Education in Imam Hussein Holy Shrine, Iraq to establish the first women's lipid clinic in Iraq, and to our knowledge, the first of its kind in the MENA and African regions.

This unique clinic, located in Khadeejat Al-Kubra Women's Hospital, Karbala City (110km Southwest of Baghdad), provides healthcare services by female clinicians exclusively to female patients suffering from familial lipid disorders. The long-term goal is to narrow the gender gap in healthcare available in this region by overcoming some of the local religious constraints concerning male clinician – female patient interaction.

We will build on our advocacy journey for familial hypercholesterolaemia (FH) paediatric screening, the Slovenian High Level Technical Meeting, the Czech EU Presidency meeting on FH screening and the outcome of it – the Prague Declaration, which has been widely endorsed in Europe and beyond. We will also present our new global strategy on tackling Lp(a) and the importance of systematic testing and managing effectively elevated Lp(a) as an independent risk factor associated with cardiovascular diseases (CVD).

The ECHAlliance Global Health Connector two-day event "Unlocking Solutions for Global Health Challenges" will take place at the CURE in New York and virtually, on 26-27 September. This internationally important event is a global platform that brings together leaders, scientists, technologists, industry, policymakers, and innovators to promote the role of science in achieving the UN Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) for a better shared future and to prepare the UN Summit of the Future 2024.
